Professor John Quigley has represented the European Union in consular law cases before the Supreme Court of the United States.

He is co-author of *Consular Law and Practice* (Oxford University Press 2008), and *The Law of Consular Access: A Documentary Guide* (Routledge 2010).

After completing his legal education at Harvard Law School, Professor Quigley was a research scholar at Moscow State University, and a research associate in comparative law at Harvard Law School.

Professor Quigley has been on the Law Faculty at the Ohio State University since 1969, where he teaches International Law and Comparative Law.
