Professor Daniel Joyner received a B.A. in Japanese from Brigham Young University, his J.D. from Duke Law School, an M.A. in political science from the University of Georgia, and a PhD in law from the University of Warwick.

Prior to joining the Alabama Law faculty in 2007, Professor Joyner taught for four years on the faculty of the School of Law at the University of Warwick. During autumn 2005, he was also a Senior Associate Member of St. Antony's College, Oxford.

Professor Joyner teaches Public International Law, International Trade and Investment Law, The Law of War, WMD Law & Policy, and Contracts.

He is the author of the *International Law and the Proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction* (OUP 2009) and *Interpreting the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty* (OUP 2011).
