The International Legal Regime Applicable to Persons at Sea

Dr. Irini Papanicolopulu is Marie Curie Fellow at the University of Oxford. She is also a Senior Researcher in international law at the University of Milano-Bicocca (on leave), where she has been teaching international law of natural resources, international law of armed conflicts and international law cases. She has also acted as legal expert for the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Italian Ministry of the Environment and the Secretariat of ACCOBAMS.

She currently works on integrating the human element into the law of the sea aiming to highlight legal gaps in law of the sea instruments relating to the treatment of individuals and groups of people at sea. She explores mechanisms for adapting the existing instruments to a more human-oriented approach and to consider how law of the sea rules could be used in order to provide for a stronger protection of individuals at sea.
