Aggregate Professor of International Law, University of Salerno

Dr. Michele Nino is Researcher of International Law and Aggregate Professor of International Law of Armed Conflicts at the University of Salerno, Italy. He is member of the Scientific Council of the Ph.D. programme "International law and national law in international matters: public ethics, stakeholders, persons and CSR (corporate social responsibility) PESPECO" of the University of Salerno and, previously, also was Professor of International Law and International Organizations at the Inter-University School of the Campania Region for Specialization in Teaching, University of Sannio.

He served as editorial assistant of the "The Global Community. Yearbook of International Law and Jurisprudence", Oxford University Press, New York, for several years and is currently member of the editorial staff of "Rivista di diritto dei trasporti e degli scambi internazionali" (Review of Transport Law and of Commercial Exchanges), Edizioni Scientifiche Italiane, Naples, and member of the editorial staff of "Diritti umani e diritto internazionale" (Human Rights and International Law Review), Il Mulino, Bologna.

He is author of a monograph "Terrorismo internazionale, privacy e protezione dei dati personali" (International Terrorism, Privacy and Personal Data Protection), and of several articles published on Italian and foreign reviews on a wide range of topics of international law and European Union law.
