PROF. MATTHEW HAPPOLD Professor of Public International Law, University of Luxembourg

Professor Matthew Happold is Professor of Public International Law at the University of Luxembourg.

He previously taught at the universities of Hull, Nottingham and Sussex, and was a researcher at the British Institute of International and Comparative Law. He is been a Visiting Fellow at the Human Rights Program, Harvard Law School and a Visiting Professional in the Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court.

His recent publications include International Law in a Multipolar World (Routledge: 2012) (editor) and Settlement of Investment Disputes under the Energy Charter Treaty (CUP: 2011) (co-author with Thomas Roe).
