PROF. JAN WOUTERS

Professor of International Law and International Organizations, University of Leuven

Professor Jan Wouters is Professor of International Law and International Organizations, Jean Monnet Chair *ad personam* EU and Global Governance, and Director of the Leuven Centre for Global Governance Studies, and the Institute for International Law at the University of Leuven. He also practices law as *Of Counsel* at Linklaters, Brussels.

He studied law and philosophy in Antwerp and Yale University (LLM 1990), was a Visiting Researcher at Harvard Law School and obtained his PhD at KU Leuven (1996). He taught at the Universities of Antwerp and Maastricht, was Visiting Professor at Liège and Kyushu University and *Référendaire* at the European Court of Justice (1991-1994).

He is a Member of the Royal Flemish Academy of Belgium for Sciences and Arts. He has published widely (around 450 publications including 40 books and 80 international journal articles).
