Associate Professor of International Law,  
University of Amsterdam

**Professor Jean d'Aspremont** is Associate Professor of International Law and Adjunct Director of the Amsterdam Research Institute for Legal Studies (ARILS). He is Guest Professor at the University of Louvain as well as the University of Lille. He is Editor-in-Chief of the Leiden Journal of International Law. He acted as counsel in proceedings before the International Court of Justice.

He previously was Assistant Professor of International Law at the University of Leiden and Director of the LL.M. in Public International Law. He received his LL.M. from the University of Cambridge and his Ph.D. from the University of Louvain. In 2005-06, he was a Global Research Fellow at New York University (NYU), affiliated with the Institute of International Law and Justice (IILJ).
