A Framework for Peace in the South China Sea



AMBASSADOR J.D. BINDENAGEL Henry Kissinger Professor Center for International Security and Governance **Bonn University**

Professor J.D. Bindenagel, born 1949, is considered the leading authority on transatlantic relations with a particular focus on the German-American relationship, which stems from his own professional experience. He spent 30 years as a career diplomat of the United States, during which time he was at the State Department, as well as Consulates and Embassies of the USA. Between 1996 and 1997 he was the American Ambassador to Germany.

James D. Bindenagel witnessed the end of the Cold War, the fall of the Berlin Wall and the reunification of Germany while in the diplomatic service of the USA. During this time he was involved in important decisions relating to security policy. As the key serving diplomat, he negotiated the reparations of labourers forced to work during the Nazi-regime, the Washington Principles on artworks confiscated by the Nazis, as well as the Kimberley-Process, which aims to prevent trade in 'blood diamonds' in Africa.

He has spent some years as Deputy Director of an American think tank and Vice President of DePaul University in Chicago, with which the University of Bonn has good ties. He is involved in many committees and organisations and is one to the founders of the "Museum des Kalten Kriegs - Teilung und Befreiung Europas" in Berlin. In 2001 the President of Germany awarded J.D. Bindenagel the Grand Cross in the Order of Merit (Großes Verdienstkreuz) of the Federal Republic of Germany.
