The International Court of Justice as an Agent of Legal Development?

PROF. CHRISTIAN TAMS

Professor of International Law, University of Glasgow

Professor Christian J. Tams holds the Chair of International Law at the University of Glasgow where he directs the Law School's activities in international law.

He studied law at the Universities of Kiel and Lyon before moving to Cambridge for his graduate studies (LLM, 2000; PhD, 2004). Between 2005 and 2009 he was assistant professor at the Walther Schücking Institute of International Law at Kiel.

His research in international law focuses on the law of state responsibility, dispute settlement and investment protection, but is based on a generalist approach to the discipline. In addition to his academic work, he has advised States in litigation before the International Court of Justice and the International Tribunal for the Law of the Sea.
